Socio-economic development of the Republic of Kazakhstan in January-March 2023

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1. Social indicators

Population size and migration

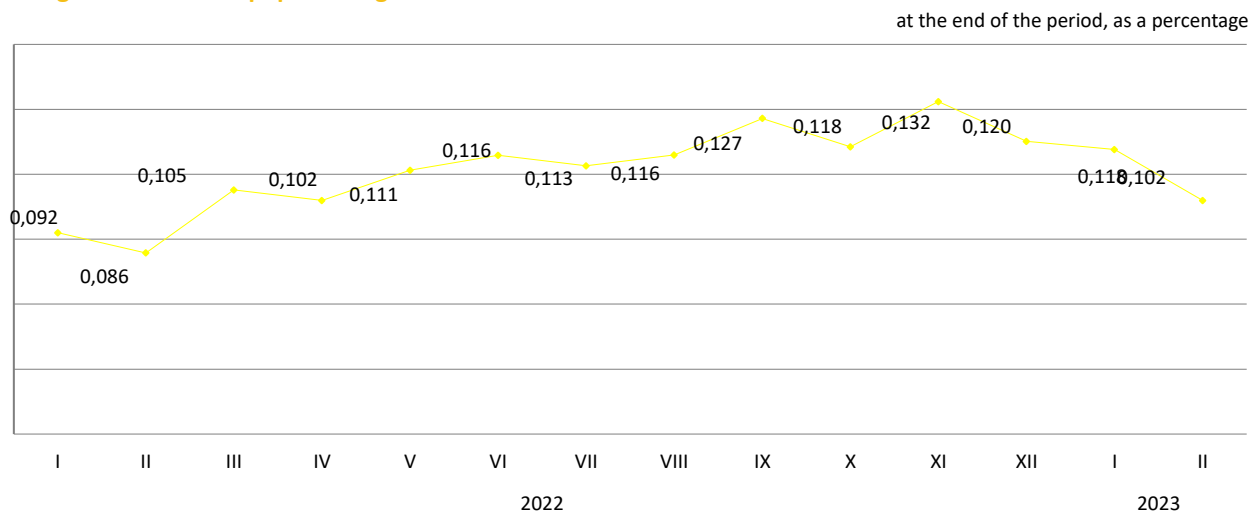
The population of the country as of March 1, 2023 amounted to 19808.4 thousand people, including urban – 12241.9 thousand (61.8%), rural – 7566.5 thousand (38.2%) people.

In January-February 2023, compared to January-February 2022, the number of arrivals in Kazakhstan increased by 81.2%, the number of departures from Kazakhstan decreased by 47.6%.

The main migration exchange of the country takes place with the CIS countries. The share of arrivals from the CIS countries and departures to these countries amounted to 90.3% and 67.3%, respectively.

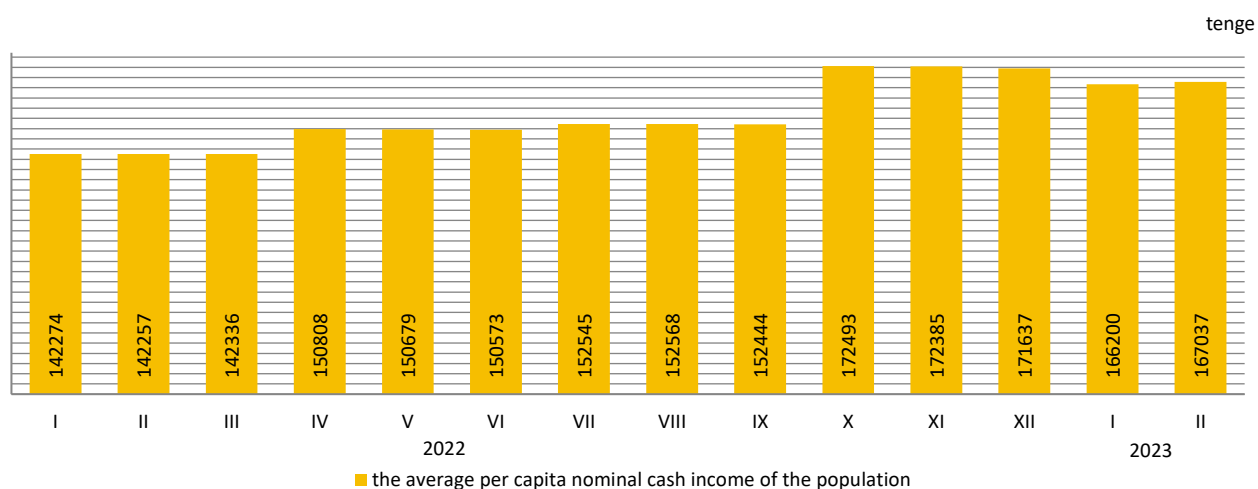
The number of migrants moving within the country decreased by 15.9%. In terms of interregional movements, a positive balance of population migration has developed in 3 regions of the country: the cities of Almaty (4919 people), Astana (4331 people) and Shymkent (151 people).

Income of the population

The average per capita nominal cash income of the population, according to an estimate in february 2023, amounted to 167 037 tenge (preliminary data), which is 17.4% higher than in February 2022, real cash income for the specified period decreased by 3.2%.

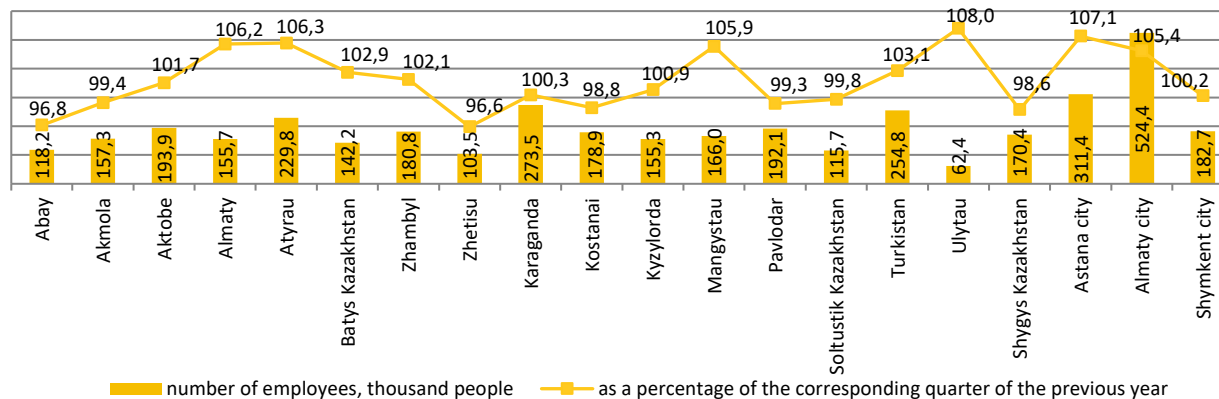
Employment of the population

The number of employees at enterprises (organizations) in the IV quarter of 2022 amounted to 3888.7 thousand people, of which at large and medium-sized enterprises - 2836.5 thousand people.

In the IV quarter of 2022, 251.5 thousand people were hired by enterprises. 244.1 thousand people dropped out for various reasons. Worked by one employee 472.2 hours.

At the end of the IV quarter of 2022, 51.4 thousand vacancies were not filled at enterprises (1.1% of the number of employees).

The number of unemployed, determined according to the methodology of the ILO, in the IV quarter¹⁾ of 2022 amounted to 456.1 thousand people, the unemployment rate was 4.8%.

The employed population²⁾ amounted to 8965.5 thousand people, including employees - 6830.9 thousand people, individual entrepreneurs - 1610.9 thousand people, persons engaged in private practice - 19.8 thousand people, individuals, who are founders (participants) of business partnerships and founders, shareholders (participants) of joint-stock companies, as well as members of production cooperatives - 5.8 thousand people, independent workers - 498.1 thousand people

In the IV quarter of 2022, the average monthly nominal salary of one employee amounted to 338715 tenge (excluding employees of small enterprises engaged in entrepreneurial activities). In the IV quarter of 2022, the median salary was estimated to be 204168 tenge.

From January 1, 2023, the minimum wage is set at 70000 tenge.

2. Economic indicators

Statistics of prices

The consumer price index in March 2023 compared to February 2023 was 100.9%. Prices for food products increased by 1.1%, paid services and non-food products - by 0.8%.

Of food products, prices increased for rice - by 3.4%, kefir 3%, drinking milk –2.1%, fresh vegetables by 2%, non-alcohol drinks – 1.7%, fresh fruits - by 1.6%, butter - 1.4%, poultry meat – 1.2%, pasta, fish and seafood, cheese and cottage cheese - 1% each. Sugar fell in price by 2.2%, buckwheat – 2%, sunflower oil – by 1.3%.

Among non-food products, prices for furniture and household items increased by 2.3%, glass and ceramic products - by 1.5%, personal goods - by 1.3%, pharmaceutical products – 1%, detergents and cleaning products – 0.9%.

The level of prices for railways passenger transport increased by 3.7%, hairdressing and personal care establishments – 2.2%, health care - by 1.5%, residential maintenance and repair - by 1.1%.

In March 2023, compared to the previous month, the producer price index for agricultural products amounted to 99.1%, crop products - 98.8%, livestock products - 99.9%. Prices for wheat fell by 2%, - 0.8%, millet - by 0.6%, dried lentils – by 0.4%, and for oats - increased by 0.4%. Potatoes fell in price by 1.1%, carrots - by 0.1%, table beet rose in price by 0.4%. Prices for poultry meat decreased by 4.1%, pig meat – 1.4%, while for they increased for cattle and sheep by 0.4%, for horses - by 0.3% each. Eggs rose in price by 3.5%, raw cow's milk fell in price by 1%.

The prices of manufacturing enterprises for industrial products in March 2023 decreased by 0.7% compared to the previous month. Prices for oil fell by 2%, for natural gas - by 1.4%, metal ores rose by 2.5%, coal - by 1.7%. Of the petroleum products, liquefied propane and butane fell in price by 1.5%, fuel oil - by 0.6%. The increase in prices was noted for ferroalloys by 2.9%, aluminum - by 1.6%, precious metals decrease by 6.6%, lead and zinc - by 3.6%, rolled ferrous metals - by 2.2%, for copper - by 1.4%. Of food products, bread went fell in price by 3.9%, wheat flour - by 2.6%, cereals - by 2.3%, vegetable oil –1.3%, poultry meat – 1%, pasta risen in price by 3.5%, milk products - by 0.7%, bread - by 0.5%.

In the service sector, tariffs for the carriage of goods by all modes of transport in March 2023 compared to January 2023 increased by 0.4%, tariffs for postal and courier services - by 0.3%.

In March 2023, compared to the previous month, the price indices in construction amounted 99.9%, in construction and installation works to 100% each, for machinery and equipment - 98.6%, for other work and costs - 99.7%.

Gross domestic product

In the structure of GDP for January-December 2022, according to current data, the production of goods amounted to 39.8%, the production of services - 52.5%. The main share in the production of GDP is occupied by industry - 29.3%, wholesale and retail trade; repair of cars and motorcycles - 16.8%.

Statistics of investments

In January-March 2023, the volume of investments in fixed assets amounted to 2741.4 billion tenge, which is 16.1% more than in January-March 2022.

The predominant sources of investment in January-March 2023 remain the own funds of economic entities, the volume of which amounted to 2216.1 billion tenge.

In January-March 2023, compared to January-March 2022, there is an increase in the cost of purchasing machinery, equipment and vehicles and their overhaul by 24.1%.

A significant share of investments in fixed assets in January-March 2023 falls on the mining industry and quarrying (36.9%), real estate operations (21.4%), manufacturing industry and transport and warehousing (8.6%).

The volume of investment investments of large enterprises in January-March 2023 amounted to 1288 billion tenge.

Statistics of domestic trade

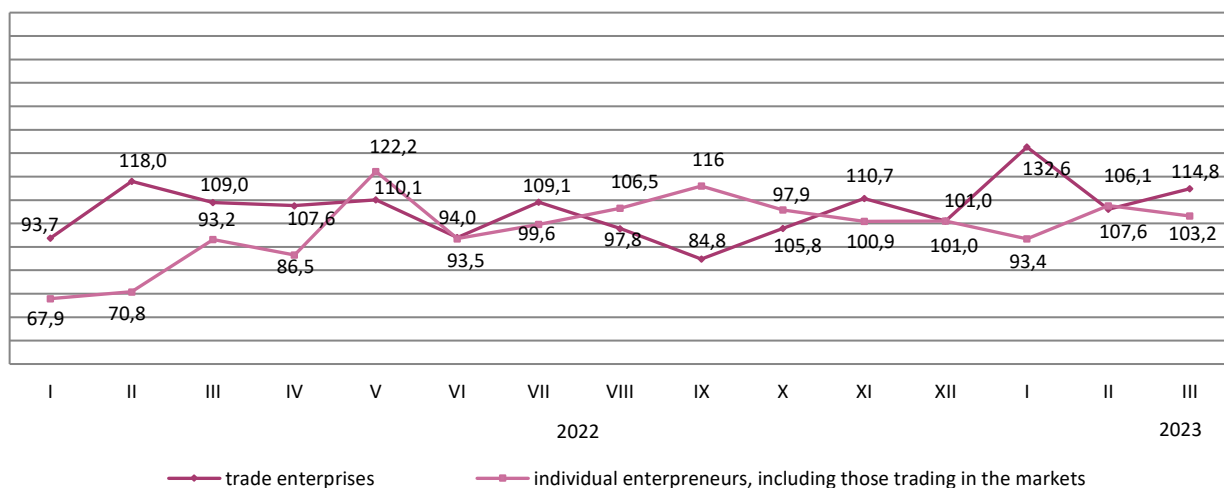
The volume of retail trade in January-March 2023 amounted to 3614.5 billion tenge, which is 12.1% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Retail sales of goods by trading enterprises increased by 16.4%, individual entrepreneurs, including those trading in the markets, increased by 1.5% compared to January-March 2022

As of April 1, 2023, the volume of commodity stocks of trading enterprises (for reporting enterprises) in retail trade amounted to 1521.7 billion tenge, in trading days - 71 days.

The share of food products in the total volume of retail trade is 28.3%, non-food products - 71.7%. The volume of sales of food products compared to January-March 2022 decreased by 5.9%, non-food products increased by 21.6%.

The volume of wholesale trade in January-March 2023 amounted to 8181.2 billion tenge, or 11.1% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Non-food products and industrial and technical products (82.2%) prevail in the structure of wholesale trade.

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year



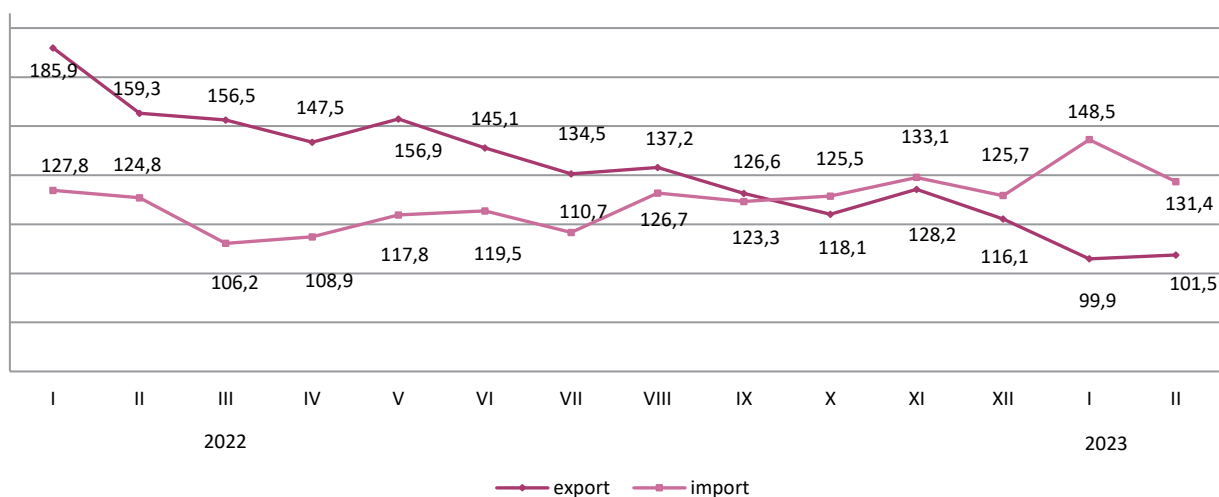
Statistics of foreign and mutual trade

According to SRCMF and BNS

Foreign trade turnover in January-February 2023 amounted to 20.9 billion US dollars (increased by 13.7% in nominal terms compared to January-February 2022), including exports – 12.2 billion US dollars (0.7% more) and imports – 8.6 billion US dollars (increased by 39.1%).

Exports with the EAEU countries amounted to 1650 million US dollars, or 33.9% more than in January-February 2022, imports – 2483.3 million US dollars, decreased by 7.1% compared to the corresponding period last year.

Statistics of agriculture, forestry, hunting and fisheries

Gross output of products (services) of agriculture, forestry and fisheries in January-March 2023 amounted to 824722.5 million tenge, including gross crop production - 37677 million tenge, livestock –778133.8 million tenge, services in agriculture –130.8 million tenge, the volume of products (services) in the hunting sector –379.6 million tenge, in forestry –4820.4 million tenge, in fisheries and aquaculture –3580.9 million tenge.

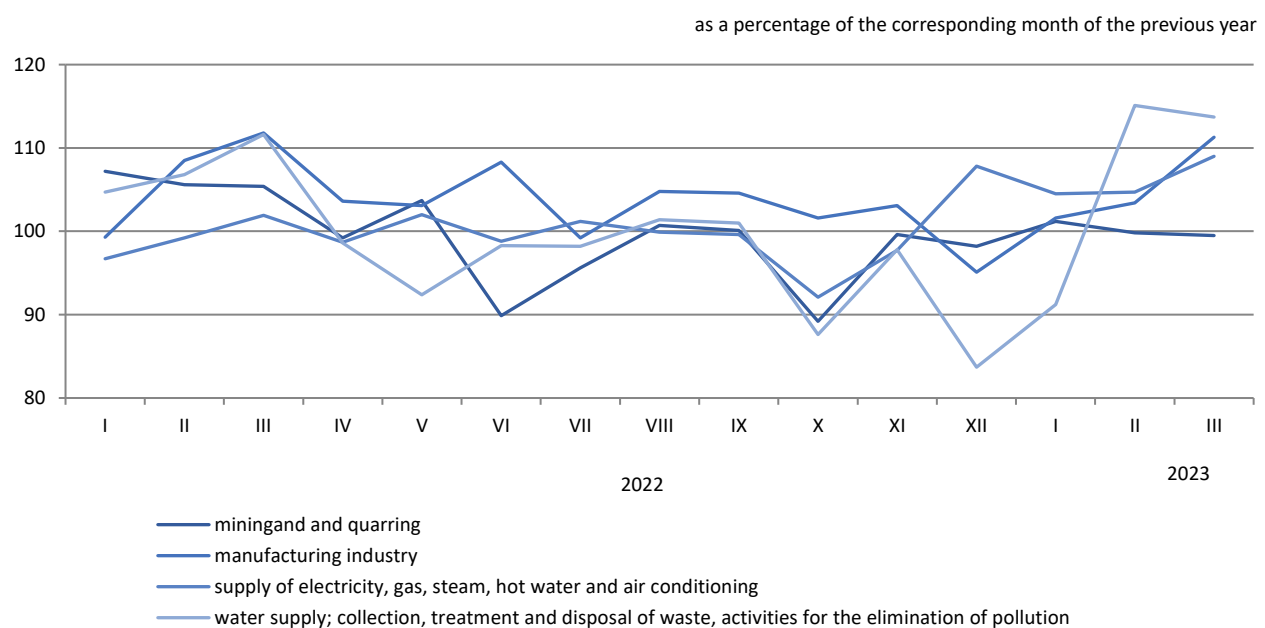

The volume of industrial production in January-March 2023 amounted to 11234 billion tenge. In the mining and quarrying industry - 5251.9 billion tenge, in the manufacturing industry - 5109.1 billion tenge, in the supply of electricity, gas, steam, hot water and air conditioning –782 billion tenge, in water supply, collection, waste treatment and disposal, pollution elimination activities - 91 billion tenge.

Statistics of building and housing construction

In January-March 2023, the volume of construction work (services) amounted to 689.9 billion tenge.

The largest amount of work in January-March 2023 was performed on the construction facilities (293 billion tenge), of non-residential buildings (284.1 billion tenge) and residential buildings (112.8 billion tenge).

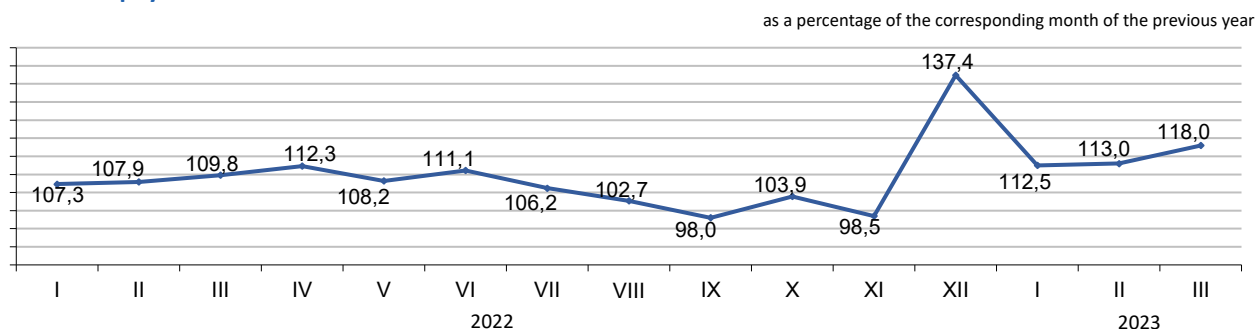
The volume of construction and installation work in January-March 2023 compared to January-March 2022 increased by 16.4 and amounted to 605.3 billion tenge. The volume of construction work on capital repairs increased by 27.8% compared to the corresponding period last year, while on current repairs it decreased by 7.3%.

In January-March 2023, the construction of 7865 new buildings was completed, of which 7359 are residential and 506 are non-residential.

The following social and cultural facilities were put into operation:

- secondary school - 5;
- preschool organizations - 4;
- hospital - 1;
- outpatient organizations - 1.

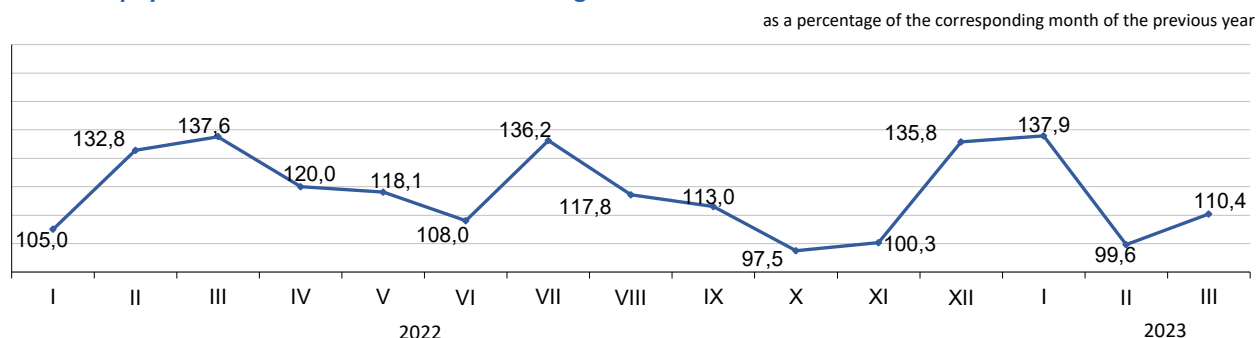
Indices of physical volume of construction



In January-March 2023, 564.1 billion tenge was allocated for housing construction. In the total volume of investments in fixed capital, the share of disbursed funds in housing construction amounted to 20.6%.

The main source of financing for housing construction in January-March 2023 is the own funds of developers, the share of which is 91.1%.

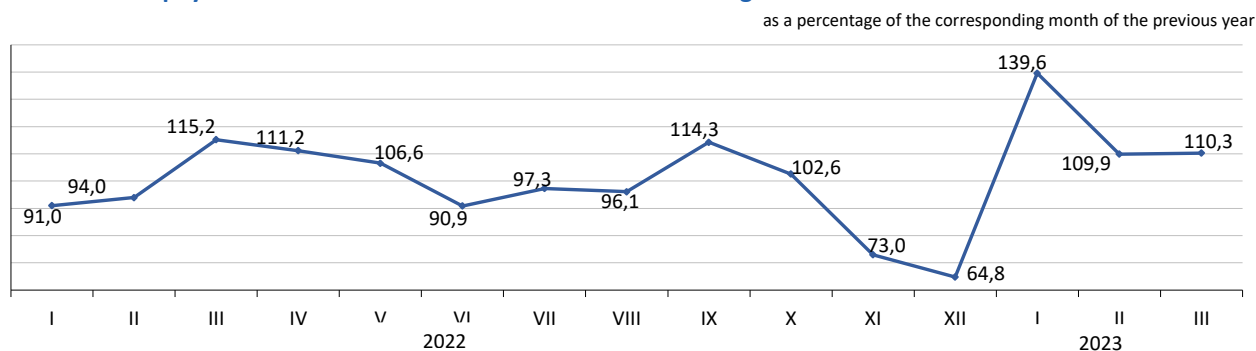
Indices of physical volume of investments in housing construction



In January-March 2023, the total area of housing put into operation increased by 17.6% and amounted to 3383.7 thousand square meters, of which in multi-apartment buildings - by 31.1% (2003.5 thousand square meters). At the same time, the total area of individual houses put into operation decreased by 2.2% (1348.6 thousand sq.m.)

In the total volume of commissioned housing, the share of multi-apartment buildings was 59.2%, individual - 39.9%. The average actual cost of construction of 1 square meter of total housing area increased by 27.6%.

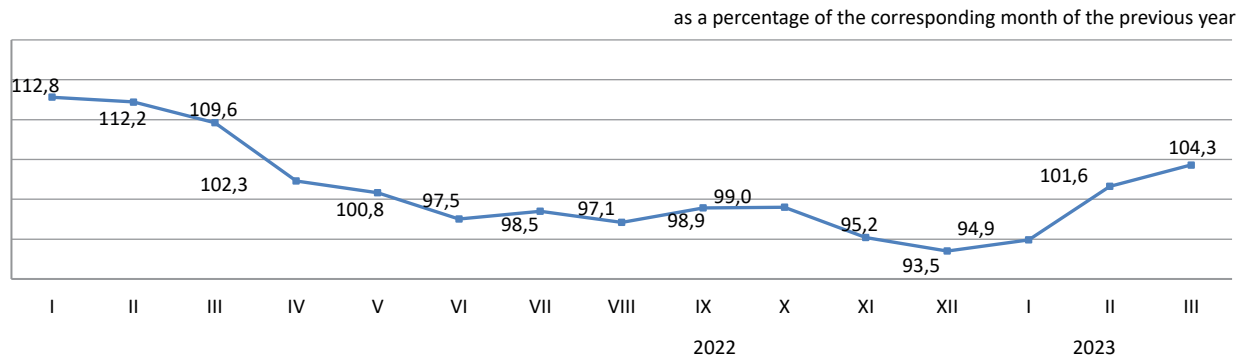
Indices of the physical volume of commissioned residential buildings

Cargo turnover

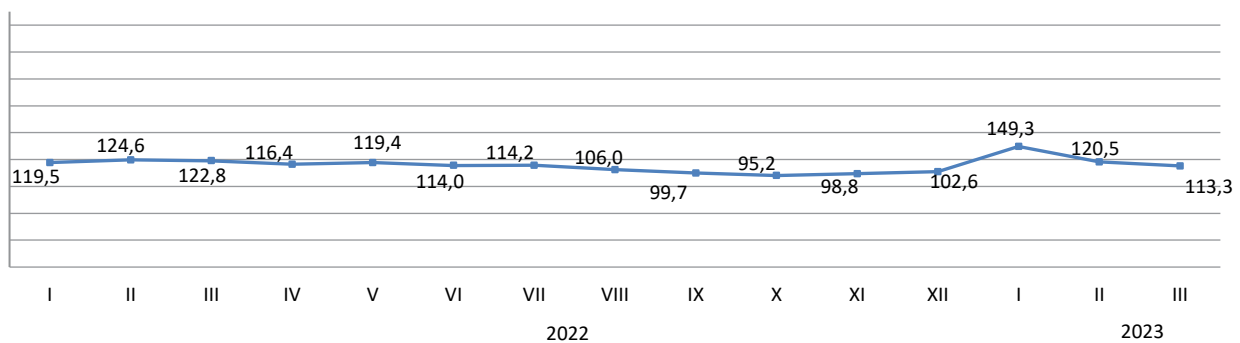

Passenger turnover

Passenger turnover in January-March 2023 increased by 25.9% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. In January-March 2023, compared to January-March 2022, there is an increase in passenger traffic in road transport (by 10.6%), air transport (by 1.7 times) and railway transport (by 11.4%).

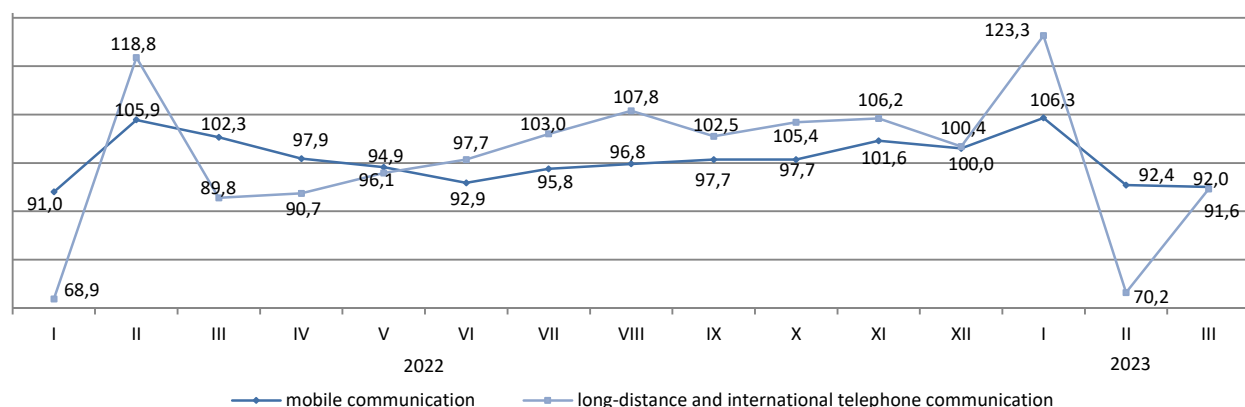
Statistics of communications

IPV for communication services in January-March 2023 compared to January-March 2022 amounted to 110.82%, of which 121.1% for Internet services, 110% for other telecommunications services and 96.5% for mobile services. A significant share in the total volume of communication services is occupied by Internet services, other telecommunication services and mobile communications, the shares of which amounted to 45.1%, 21.1% and 21%, respectively.

The output of products (goods and services) by SMEs in January-December 2022 amounted to 59221.5 billion tenge.

The number of operating SMEs as of April 1, 2023 amounted to 1939.8 thousand units.

The number of employees in SMEs as of January 1, 2023 amounted 4109.7 thousand people.

SME subjects

In January-December 2022, the largest shares of output (goods, services) by SMEs were observed in Almaty (26.6%), Astana (19.3%), Atyrau (10.5%), Almaty (4.8%), Karaganda (4.1%) and West Kazakhstan (3.8%) regions.

The largest number of active individual entrepreneurs is concentrated in Almaty (15.5%) of the total number, in Astana (10.9%), Shymkent (7.2%), Turkestan (8.4%), Almaty (6.4%) and Karaganda (5.2%) regions.

According to the statistical register, a significant number of actively working peasant or farm farms were recorded in Turkestan (30.6%), Almaty (10.9%), Zhambyl (9.9%) and Zhetisu (7.7%) regions.

Debt of enterprises

As of January 1, 2023, wage arrears at enterprises of the republic amounted to 280.1 billion tenge and increased by 14.1% compared to the corresponding period of 2022. The overdue debt amounted to about 0.2 billion tenge or 0.1% of the total wage arrears.
