Socio-economic development of the Republic of Kazakhstan in January-June 2023

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1. Social indicators

Population size and migration

The population of the country as of June 1, 2023 amounted to 19879,0 thousand people, including urban – 12297,1 thousand (61.9%), rural – 7581,9 thousand (38.1%) people.


In January-May 2023, compared to January-May 2022, the number of arrivals in Kazakhstan increased by 91.8%, the number of departures from Kazakhstan decreased by 45.0%.

The main migration exchange of the country takes place with the CIS countries. The share of arrivals from the CIS countries and departures to these countries amounted to 89.5% and 72.1%, respectively.

The number of migrants moving within the country decreased by 2.6%. In terms of interregional movements, a positive balance of population migration has developed in 3 regions of the country: the cities of Almaty (12145 people), Astana (11424 people) and Shymkent (571 people).

Income of the population

The average per capita nominal cash income of the population, according to an estimate in may 2023, amounted to 170129 tenge (preliminary data), which is 12.9% higher than in may 2022, real cash income for the specified period decreased by 2.6%.


Employment of the population

The number of employees at enterprises (organizations) in the I quarter of 2023 amounted to 3917.3 thousand people, of which at large and medium-sized enterprises - 2877 thousand people.

In the I quarter of 2023, 256.4 thousand people were hired by enterprises. 253.9 thousand people dropped out for various reasons. Worked by one employee 449.6 hours.

At the end of the I quarter of 2023, 52.3 thousand vacancies were not filled at enterprises (1.3% of the number of employees)

The number of unemployed, determined according to the methodology of the ILO, in the I quarter¹⁾ of 2023 amounted to 453.4 thousand people, the unemployment rate was 4.8%.

The employed population²⁾ amounted to 9031.9 thousand people, including employees - 6900.4 thousand people, individual entrepreneurs - 1662.8 thousand people, persons engaged in private practice - 17.4 thousand people, individuals, who are founders (participants) of business partnerships and founders, shareholders (participants) of joint-stock companies, as well as members of production cooperatives - 13.5 thousand people, independent workers - 437.8 thousand people

In the I quarter of 2023, the average monthly nominal salary of one employee amounted to 340636 tenge (excluding employees of small enterprises engaged in entrepreneurial activities). In the I quarter of 2023, the median salary was estimated to be 225736 tenge.

From January 1, 2023, the minimum wage is set at 70000 tenge.

2. Economic indicators

Statistics of prices

The consumer price index in June 2023 compared to May 2023 was 100.5%. Prices for non–food products increased by 0.7%, paid services by– 0.6%, food products by– 0.2%.

The increase in prices in June was observed on furniture and household items by 2.6%, suitcases, travel bags – by 1.4%, bicycles – by 1.2%, personal goods - by 1%. Compared to last month, prices for construction materials increased by 0.8%, clothing and footwear, pharmaceutical products – by 0.7%. Gasoline Al-95/96 rose by 1.1%, liquefied gas in cylinders – by 0.7%.

The increase in prices was noted for air passenger transport services by 9.6%, the organization of complex recreation – by 8.8%, sanatorium services – by 6%, residential maintenance and repair services – by 1.6%, catering – by 1.4%, healthcare – by 0.9%.

Of food products, potato prices increased by 9.9%, grapes – by 4%, lemons – by 3.9%, apples – by 3.1%. The increase in prices was noted for mineral and drinking water, soft drinks – by 2.4%, fruit and vegetable juices – by 1.8%. Bananas fell by 10.6%, fresh vegetables – by 8.8%, eggs – by 5.9%, sunflower oil – by 4.2%, buckwheat groats – by 4.1%.

In June 2023, compared with the previous month, the price index of producers of agricultural products amounted to 99.1%, crop production - 99%, livestock products - 99.4%. Buckwheat prices decreased by 2.4%,wheat - by 1.3%, sunflower seeds - by 0.9%,and millet - increased by 1.2%, dried lentils - by 0.5%. Tomatoes of the closed groundfell in price by 15.8%, table beet - by 3.9%, cucumbers of the closed ground - by 1.4%, cabbage - by 1%, bulb onions - by 0.7%, and potato - increased by 0.5%, carrot and garlic - by 0.3%. A decrease in prices was noted for pigs by 0.3%, an increase - for poultry meat by 3%, for cattle - by 0.7%. Eggs fell in price by 9.2%, raw cow's milk - by 1.2%.

Prices of manufacturing enterprises for industrial products in June 2023 decreased by 0.9% compared to the previous month. Oil prices have become lower by 1.8%, metal ores - by 1.4%. Of petroleum products, propane and butane liquefied fell by 0.9%. A decrease in prices was noted for zinc by 11%, lead - by 8.5%, copper - by 6.7%, rolled ferrous metals and aluminum - by 1.9%, precious metals - by 0.9%, ferroalloys - by 0.6%. From food products, vegetable oil fell by 4.6%, wheat flour - by 2%, cereals - by 1.9%, bread - by 0.4%, sugar - by 0.3%, rice rose by 1.2%, poultry meat - by 0.5%.

In the service sector, tariffs for the carriage of goods by all modes of transport in June 2023 compared to May2023 increased-by 0.4%, tariffs for communication services, postal and courier services – by 0.1%.

In Jun 2023, compared to the previous month, the price index in construction amounted to 100.2%, for construction and installation work –100.2%, for machinery and equipment – 99.4%, for other work and costs – 99.9%.

Gross domestic product

In the structure of GDP for January-March 2023, according to reporting data, the production of goods amounted to 35.4%, the production of services - 55.7%. The main share in the production of GDP is occupied by industry - 29.1%, wholesale and retail trade; repair of cars and motorcycles - 16.1%.

According to the a reporting data, in the sectoral structure of income formation for January-March 2023, the share of wages in the production of goods and services amounted to 23 % and 35.2%, respectively, the share of other taxes on production is 2.2 % in the production of goods and 1.7 % in the production of services, the share of gross profit/gross mixed income was 74.8% and 63.1%.

The Gross Domestic Product calculated by the final expenditure method for January - March 2023 amounted to 23190740,7 million tenge. In comparison with the corresponding period of last year in real terms there is an increase in the component of final consumption expenditure: households – by 9.8%, government – by 8.4% and non-profit organizations serving households – by 5%.

Statistics of investments

In January-June 2023, the volume of investments in fixed capital amounted to 6717.6 billion tenge, which is 13.1% more than in January-June 2022.

The predominant sources of investment financing remain the own funds of economic entities, the volume of which in January-June 2023 amounted to 5165.5 billion tenge.

In January-June 2023, compared with January-June 2022, there is an increase costs for the purchase of machinery, equipment and vehicles and their capital repairs by 16.8%.

A significant share of investments in fixed capital in January-June 2023 accounted for mining and quarrying (32.9%), operations with real estate (19.4%), transport and warehousing (11.3%) and manufacturing industry (8.7%).

The volume of investments of large enterprises in January-June 2023 amounted to 2877.4 billion tenge.

Statistics of domestic trade


The volume of retail trade in January-June 2023 amounted to 7759.5 billion tenge, which is 8.8% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Retail sales of goods by trading enterprises increased by 11.9%, individual entrepreneurs, including those trading in the markets, increased by 1.5% compared to January-June 2022

As of July 1, 2023, the volume of commodity stocks of trading enterprises (for reporting enterprises) in retail trade amounted to 1538 billion tenge, in trading days - 72 days.

The share of food products in the total volume of retail trade is 29.3%, non-food products - 70.7%. The volume of sales of food products compared to January-June 2022 decreased by 6.4%, non-food products increased by 16.8%.

The volume of wholesale trade in January-June 2023 amounted to 17612.4 billion tenge, or 11.1% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Non-food products and industrial and technical products (82.6%) prevail in the structure of wholesale trade.






Statistics of foreign and mutual trade

According to SRCMF and BNS

Foreign trade turnover in January-May 2023 amounted to 55.8 billion US dollars (increased by 8% in nominal terms compared to January-May 2022), including exports – 31.6 billion US dollars (7.7% less) and imports – 24.2 billion US dollars (increased by 38.8%).

Exports with the EAEU countries amounted to 4455.5 million US dollars, or 45.3% more than in January-May 2022, imports – 6974.4 million US dollars, decreased by 4.2% compared to the corresponding period last year.



Statistics of agriculture, forestry, hunting and fisheries

Gross output of products (services) of agriculture, forestry and fisheries in January-June 2023 amounted to 2091.8 billion tenge, including gross crop production - 79.3 billion tenge, Livestock - 1991.5 billion tenge, services in agriculture-1.1 billion tenge, the volume of products (services) in the hunting sector-0.8 billion tenge, in forestry - 9.6 billion tenge, in fisheries and aquaculture - 9.5 billion tenge.


Statistics of industrial production

The volume of industrial production in January-June 2023 amounted to 22611.9 billion tenge. In the mining and quarrying industry - 10490.2 billion tenge, in the manufacturing industry - 10587.6 billion tenge, in the supply of electricity, gas, steam, hot water and air conditioning - 1346.5 billion tenge, in water supply, collection, waste treatment and disposal, pollution elimination activities - 187.6 billion tenge.

Statistics of building and housing construction

In January-June 2023, the volume of construction work (services) amounted to 2403,2 billion tenge.

The largest amount of work in January-June 2023 was performed on the construction of facilities (1053.9 billion tenge), non-residential buildings (960.5 billion tenge), and residential buildings (388.8 billion tenge).

The volume of construction and installation work in January-June 2023 compared to January-June2022 increased by 13.4 and amounted to 2060.9 billiontenge. The volume of construction work on capital repairs increased by 26.5% compared to the corresponding period last year, while on current repairs it decreased by 9.7%.

In January-June 2023, the construction of 17679 new buildings was completed, of which 16677 are residential and 1002are non-residential. The following social and cultural facilities were put into operation:

- secondary school 15;
- preschool organizations 17;
- hospital 1;
- outpatient organizations 7.

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year




In January-June 2023, 1261,7 billion tenge was allocated for housing construction. In the total volume of investments in fixed capital, the share of disbursed funds in housing construction amounted to 18.8%.

The main source of financing for housing construction in January-June 2023 is the own funds of developers, the share of which is 87.9%.

In January-June 2023, the total area of housing put into operation increased by 11.8% and amounted to 7370.5 thousand square meters, of which in multi-apartment buildings - by 21.2% (4321.7 thousand square meters, in individual houses - by 0.9% (3009 thousand sq.m.)

In the total volume of commissioned housing, the share of multi-apartment buildings was 58.6%, individual - 40.8%. The average actual cost of construction of 1 square meter of total housing area increased by 23.3%.

Indices of the physical volume of commissioned residential buildings




Statistics of transport

Cargo turnover

Cargo turnover for January-June 2023 decreased by 2.5% from the level of the corresponding period of the previous year. In January-June 2023, compared to January-June 2022, there is a increase in the turnover of railway transport (by 5.9%) and air transport (by 7.6%).



Passenger turnover

Passenger turnover in January-June 2023 increased by 114.4% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. In January-June 2023, compared to January-June 2022, there is an increase in passenger traffic in road transport (by 2.4%), air transport (by 46.5%) and railway transport (by 3.2%).





Statistics of communications

IPV for communication services in January-June 2023 compared to January-June 2022 amounted to 108,8%, of which 118,2% for Internet services, 108,2% for other telecommunications services and 94,7% for mobile services. A significant share in the total volume of communication services is occupied by Internet services, mobile communications and other telecommunication services, the shares of which amounted to 45,7%, 21% and 20,7%, respectively.

The structure of performance indicators for SMEs as of July 1, 2023

The output of products by SME entities in January-March 2023 amounted to 13631.6 billion rubles.

SME entities as of July 1, 2023 amounted to 2015 thousand units;

The number of people employed in SME as of April 1, 2023 amounted to 4,152.1 thousand people.

In January-March 2023 the largest shares of output (goods, services) by SMEs were observed Zhambyl (38,8%), Shymkentcity (36,9%), Shygys-Kazakhstan (22,9%), Aktobe (19,9%), Turkistan (18,1%) and Almaty (18%) regions.

The largest number of operating individual entrepreneurs is concentrated in Almaty city (15.8%) of the total, Astana city (10.9%), Shymkent city (7.3%), Turkistan (8.6%), Almaty (6.6%) and Karaganda (5.1%) regions.

At the same time, a significant number of active peasant or farm enterprises were recorded in Turkistan (30.3%), Almaty (10.7%), Zhambyl (10.4%) and Zhetisu (7.6%) regions.
