Socio-economic development of the Republic of Kazakhstan in January-May 2023

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1. Social indicators

Population size and migration

The population of the country as of May 1, 2023 amounted to 19 854,1 thousand people, including urban – 12 276,4 thousand (61.8%), rural – 7 577,7 thousand (38.2%) people.

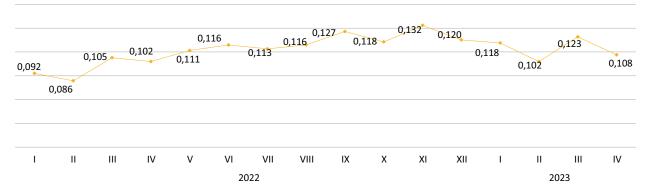
In January-April 2023, compared to January-April 2022, the number of arrivals in Kazakhstan increased by 90.1%, the number of departures from Kazakhstan decreased by 47.5%.

The main migration exchange of the country takes place with the CIS countries. The share of arrivals from the CIS countries and departures to these countries amounted to 89.7% and 70.6%, respectively.

The number of migrants moving within the country decreased by 10.6%. In terms of interregional movements, a positive balance of population migration has developed in 3 regions of the country: the cities of Almaty (8 990 people), Astana (8 685 people) and Shymkent (472 people).

Income of the population

The average per capita nominal cash income of the population, according to an estimate in april 2023, amounted to 166981 tenge (preliminary data), which is 10.7% higher than in april 2022, real cash income for the specified period decreased by 5.2%.

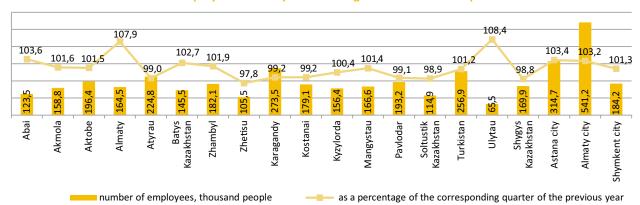
Employment of the population

The number of employees at enterprises (organizations) in the I quarter of 2023 amounted to 3917.3 thousand people, of which at large and medium-sized enterprises - 2877.0 thousand people.

In the I quarter of 2023, 256.4 thousand people were hired by enterprises. 253.9 thousand people dropped out for various reasons. Worked by one employee 449.6 hours.

At the end of the I quarter of 2023, 52.3 thousand vacancies were not filled at enterprises (1.3% of the number of employees)

The number of unemployed, determined according to the methodology of the ILO, in the I quarter¹⁾ of 2023 amounted to 453.4 thousand people, the unemployment rate was 4.8%.

The employed population²⁾ amounted to 9031.9 thousand people, including employees - 6900.4 thousand people, individual entrepreneurs - 1662.8 thousand people, persons engaged in private practice - 17.4 thousand people, individuals, who are founders (participants) of business partnerships and founders, shareholders (participants) of joint-stock companies, as well as members of production cooperatives - 13.5 thousand people, independent workers - 437.8 thousand people

In the I quarter of 2023, the average monthly nominal salary of one employee amounted to 340636 tenge (excluding employees of small enterprises engaged in entrepreneurial activities). In the I quarter of 2023, the median salary was estimated to be 225736 tenge.

From January 1, 2023, the minimum wage is set at 70000 tenge.

2. Economic indicators

Statistics of prices

The consumer price index in May 2023 compared to April 2023 was 100.6%. Prices for paid services increased by 0.7%, food and non–food products - by 0.5%.

The level of prices for air passenger transport services increased by 11.5%, sanatoriums – by 5.6%, in the field of recreation and sports events – by 2.9%, railway passenger transport – by 2.5%.

Among food products, an increase in prices was noted for cabbage by 23.8%, onions – by 9.9%, grapes – by 9.6%, carrots – by 8.6%, apples – by 5.3%, potatoes – by 4%, rice – by 2.5%, soft drinks – by 1.9%, drinking milk – by 1.8%, tea – by 1.6%, bakery and flour confectionery – by 1.3%, fermented milk products, pasta, confectionery – by 1.1%. Cucumbers fell by 39.6%, tomatoes – by 23.7%, sweet peppers – by 7.6%, buckwheat groats – by 4%, bananas – by 3.8%.

Among non–food products, the prices of liquefied gas in cylinders increased by 1.7%, gasoline - by 1.2%. The increase in prices for clothing and footwear amounted to 1.3%, personal goods -1%, tableware -0.9%, detergents and cleaning products -0.8%.

In May 2023, compared with the previous month, the price index of producers of agricultural products amounted to 99%, crop production - 99.3%, livestock products – 98.1%. Dried peas prices decreased by 0.9%, wheat - by 0.7%, barley – by 0.4%, and rice - increased by 0.7%, millet - by 0.6%, oats - by 0.5%. Cucumbers of the closed ground fell in price by 22.2%, tomatoes of the closed ground - by 11.1%. A decrease in prices was noted for poultry meat by 5.5%, pigs – by 0.7%, an increase – for cattle by 0.3%. Eggs fell in price by 7.2%, raw milk rose in price by 0.4%.

Prices of manufacturing enterprises for industrial products in May 2023 increased by 0.5% compared to the previous month. Oil prices became higher by 1.5%, natural gas prices - lower by 2%, metal ores - by 0.9%, coal - by 0.7%. Of petroleum products, gasoline rose by 9.2%, fuel oil - by 1.9%, propane and butane liquefied fell by 3.1%. An increase in prices was noted for lead by 6.8%, rolled ferrous metals - by 2.7%, precious metals - by 1.7%, ferroalloys - a decrease of 3.6%, zinc - by 1.5%. From food products, rye flour rose in price by 2%, pasta - by 0.9%, sugar fell by 3.5%, cereals - by 2.8%, vegetable oil - by 2.7%, poultry meat - by 2.3%, wheat flour - by 1.6%, bread - by 0.7%, tea - by 0.5%.

In the service sector, tariffs for the carriage of goods by all modes of transport in May 2023 compared to April 2023 decreased by 0.1%, tariffs for communication services, postal and courier services did not change.

In May 2023, compared to the previous month, the price index in construction amounted to 104%, for construction and installation work - 104.4%, for machinery and equipment – 99.8%, for other work and costs – 101%.

Gross domestic product

In the structure of GDP for January-March 2023, preliminary data, the production of goods amounted to 35.1%, the production of services - 55.9%. The main share in the production of GDP is occupied by industry - 29%, wholesale and retail trade; repair of cars and motorcycles - 16.2%.

Statistics of investments

In January-May 2023, the volume of investments in fixed capital amounted to 5075.7 billion tenge, which is 17.2% more than in January-May 2022.

The predominant sources of investment financing remain the own funds of economic entities, the volume of which in January-May 2023 amounted to 3981.7 billion tenge.

In January-May 2023, compared with January-May 2022, there is an increase costs for the purchase of machinery, equipment and vehicles and their capital repairs by 22.3%.

A significant share of investments in fixed capital in January-May 2023 accounted for mining and quarrying (35.3%), operations with real estate (20%), transport and warehousing (10.3%) and manufacturing industry (8.6%).

The volume of investments of large enterprises in January-May 2023 amounted to 2305.5 billion tenge.

Statistics of domestic trade

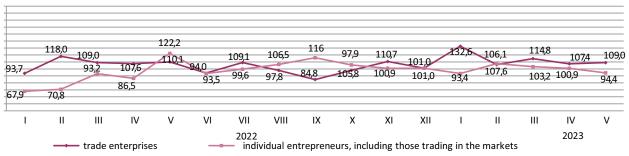
The volume of retail trade in January-May 2023 amounted to 6107.4 billion tenge. which is 9.3% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Retail sales of goods by trading enterprises increased by 12.8%. individual entrepreneurs. including those trading in the markets. increased by 0.1% compared to January-May 2022

As of June 1, 2023, the volume of commodity stocks of trading enterprises (for reporting enterprises) in retail trade amounted to 1551.4 billion tenge, in trading days - 73 days.

The share of food products in the total volume of retail trade is 28.2%, non-food products - 71.8%. The volume of sales of food products compared to January-May 2022 decreased by 6.4%, non-food products increased by 17.3%.

The volume of wholesale trade in January-May 2023 amounted to 14331.4 billion tenge, or 10.5% more than the corresponding period in 2022. Non-food products and industrial and technical products (82.7%) prevail in the structure of wholesale trade.





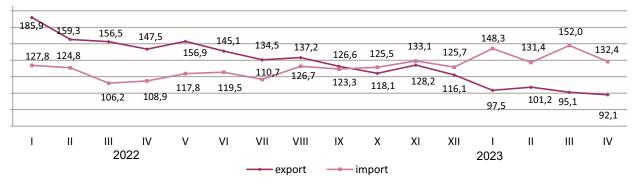
Statistics of foreign and mutual trade

According to SRCMF and BNS

Foreign trade turnover in January-April 2023 amounted to 44.4 billion US dollars (increased by 11.1% in nominal terms compared to January-April 2022), including exports –25.5 billion US dollars (3.8% less) and imports – 18.9 billion US dollars (increased by 40.5%).

Exports with the EAEU countries amounted to 3536.1 million US dollars, or 47% more than in January-April 2022, imports –5463.4 million US dollars, decreased by 3% compared to the corresponding period last year.

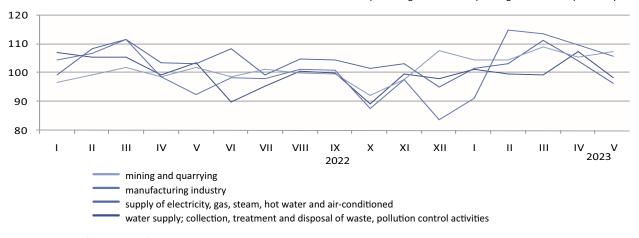
Statistics of industrial production

The volume of industrial production in January-May 2023 amounted to 18789.9 billion tenge. In the mining and quarrying industry -8791.9 billion tenge, in the manufacturing industry -8673 billion tenge, in the supply of electricity, gas, steam, hot water and air conditioning -1168.8 billion tenge, in water supply, collection , waste treatment and disposal , pollution elimination activities -156.2 billion tenge.

Statistics of building and housing construction

In January-May 2023. the volume of construction work (services) amounted to 1489.7 billion tenge (112.1%).

The largest amount of work in January-May 2023 was performed on the construction of non-residential buildings (636.9 billion tenge). facilities (621.3 billion tenge). and residential buildings (231.5 billion tenge).

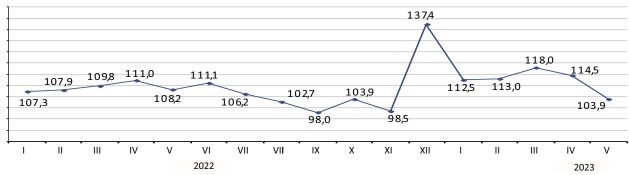
The volume of construction and installation work in January-May 2023 compared to January-May 2022 increased by 13.4 and amounted to 1312.9 billiontenge. The volume of construction work on capital repairs increased by 18.2% compared to the corresponding period last year. while on current repairs it decreased by 10.3%.

In January-May 2023. the construction of 13722 new buildings was completed. of which 12930 are residential and 792 are non-residential. The following social and cultural facilities were put into operation:

- secondary school 11;
- preschool organizations 13;
- hospital 1;
- outpatient organizations 3.

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year

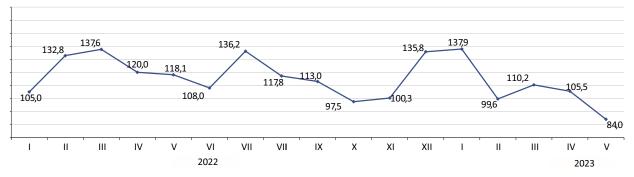


In January- May 2023. 978.3 billion tenge was allocated for housing construction. In the total volume of investments in fixed capital. the share of disbursed funds in housing construction amounted to 19.3%.

The main source of financing for housing construction in January- May 2023 is the own funds of developers. the share of which is 89%.

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year

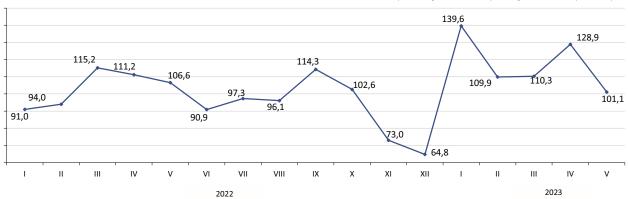


In January- May 2023, the total area of housing put into operation increased by 15.4% and amounted to 5470.3 thousand square meters, of which in multi-apartment buildings - by 27.7% (3098.1 thousand square meters). At the same time, the total area of individual houses put into operation decreased by 2.5% (2335.5 thousand sq.m.)

In the total volume of commissioned housing. the share of multi-apartment buildings was 56.6%. individual - 42.7%. The average actual cost of construction of 1 square meter of total housing area increased by 23.2%.

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year

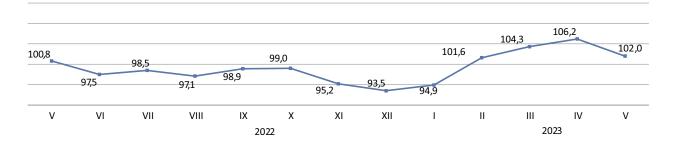


Statistics of transport

Cargo turnover

Cargo turnover for January-May 2023 decreased by 2% from the level of the corresponding period of the previous year. In January-May 2023. compared to January-May 2022. there is a increase in the turnover of railway transport (by 6%) and air transport (by 17.6%).

as a percentage of the corresponding month of the previous year



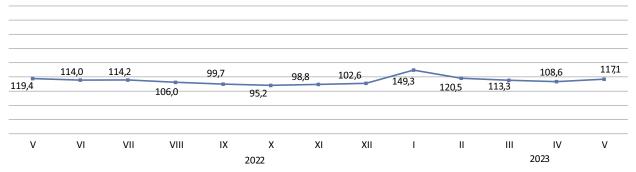

Passenger turnover

Passenger turnover in January-May 2023 increased by 117.1% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. In January-May 2023. compared to January-May 2022. there is an increase in passenger traffic in road transport (by 3.6%). air transport (by 1.5 times) and railway transport (by 5.9%).

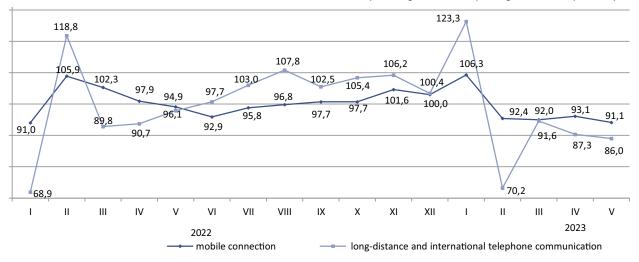
Statistics of communications

IPV for communication services in January- May 2023 compared to January- May 2022 amounted to 109.1%, of which 119.3% for Internet services, 107.7% for other telecommunications services and 94.7% for mobile services. A significant share in the total volume of communication services is occupied by Internet services, mobile communications and other telecommunication services, the shares of which amounted to 45.6%, 20.9% and 20.8%, respectively.

Small and medium business

The structure of performance indicators for SMEs as of June 1, 2023

According to the Statistical Business Register, the largest number of operating individual entrepreneurs is concentrated in Almaty city (15.6%) of the total, Astana city (10.9%), Turkistan (8.7%), Shymkent city (7.3%), Almaty (6.5%) and Karaganda (5.1%) regions.

At the same time, a significant number of active peasant or farm enterprises were recorded in Turkistan (30.3%), Almaty (10.7%), Zhambyl (10.5%) and Zhetisu (7.5%) regions.

Debt of enterprises

As of January 1, 2023, wage arrears at enterprises of the republic amounted to 280.1 billion tenge and increased by 14.1% compared to the corresponding period of 2022. The overdue debt amounted to about 0.2 billion tenge or 0.1% of the total wage arrears.
