- S.2 Introduction relevance

Labor market indicators are important elements of the characteristics of the state of the economy as a whole and for individual types of economic activity. A sample survey of employment of the population is one of the methods and sources of collecting extensive data, which characterize in detail and comprehensively the situation of the population in the labor market and provide information that cannot be obtained from other sources.

The information obtained from the survey is comparable at the international level in terms of concepts, definitions and methodology for calculating indicators.

The purpose of the survey is to obtain up-to-date data on the state of the labor market, in particular:

- by the number of labor force;
- by the number of employed population;
- by the number of unemployed;
- by the number of persons not included in the labor force;
- by socio-demographic composition;
- by classification and grouping according to various characteristics.

The survey results allow us to estimate the number of employed and unemployed people, their distribution by gender, age, marital status, education and professional composition, categories of employment and circumstances of unemployment, methods of additional employment, ways of finding work, which is especially important in a market economy, in which the labor market canfunction in both organized and unorganized forms.

- S.4.1 Description of data

Labor force – employed and unemployed population.

An employed person is an individual who carries out activities for payment or by generating income through the use of property, production and sale of goods, performance of work, or provision of services.

An unemployed person is an individual who is looking for work and is ready to start working.

Persons not in the labour force are persons who are not employed or unemployed.

S.4.3 Sectoral coverage

The employment survey is conducted in all regions of the republic based on the sample observation method with subsequent dissemination of the results to the entire population. The objects of observation are households (individuals aged 15 years and older).

 - 1) A household is an economic entity consisting of one or more individuals living together, pooling all or part of their income and property, and consuming goods and services together. The survey involves 227,785 households.
 - 2) An employee is an individual performing work under an employment contract or carrying out activities under a civil law contract, in which the schedule and payment for the time worked or for a unit of goods produced, or for services rendered are determined by the customer;
 - 3) Self-employed persons are individuals engaged in the production (sale) of goods, works and services individually without an employment contract.
 - 5. Data collection tool Statistical form "Questionnaire for a sample survey

of employment of the population", index T-001, frequency monthly. The statistical form is available on the Internet resource of the Bureauhttp://stat.gov.kzin the section "For respondents" / Statistical forms / Monthly forms. The form was approved by the Head of the Bureau of National Statistics of the Agency for Strategic Planning and Reforms of the Republic of Kazakhstan on August 27, 2022, No. 19.

S.4.5 Statistical object

Households and individuals aged 15 years and over. The unlimited upper age limit allows for a more precise assessment of the possible participation in the labour market of retired individuals who continue to work, the lower age limit for adolescents, and also to ensure international comparability of data.

S.4.6 General population (principle of selection of survey units)

The questionnaire of the sample survey of employment of the population is carried out on the basis of the sample observation method.

The information base for forming the sample of households is the SHR.

The use of this database is due to a number of advantages:

the presence of a ready-made sampling frame, which eliminates one of the significant cost items associated with the compilation of the sampling frame;
the presence of a constantly updated database, which is necessary for the

implementation of household rotation;

- availability of information about households at a territorial level.

The number of households in the general population is 5,610,082 households. The sample population is 227,785 households or 4.1% of the general population, and the reserve is 100%. Households living in all types of residential premises are subject to the survey, with the exception of those living in shared communal apartments, dormitories, boarding houses for the elderly and disabled, orphanages, prisons, hotels, religious communities and other similar residential premises. In order to reduce the burden on interviewers when collecting information, settlements with fewer than 100 households are excluded from the general population.

The completeness of the data is ensured by following the methodological recommendations in accordance with the "Methodology for constructing a sample of households for the employment survey", approved by the order of the Chairman of the Statistics Committee of the Ministry of National Economy of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated June 30, 2016 No. 132, and the instructions for filling out the statistical form of the general state statistical observation "Questionnaire of the sample employment surveys" (index T-001, monthly frequency), approved by the order of the Head of the Bureaunational statistics of the Agency for Strategic Planning and Reforms of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated August 27, 2022 No. 19.

In the event of a shortage of selected households, the addresses of residential premises from the reserve list are replaced. The interviewer questions members of households living at addresses only according to the lists provided in the sample.

The lack of responses from selected households is a serious drawback that distorts the survey results. In these conditions, it is necessary to compensate for the missing data. This procedure is designed to complete the calculation of indicators, to compensate for the missing data of the sample survey. During the survey, there are cases when it is not possible to interview households. There are two types of reasons: objective and subjective.

Objective reasons for refusal:

all household members aged 73 years and older;

the house is destroyed;

left, empty apartment (house);

combining apartments;

house to be demolished;

house (address) not found;

other reason (change in the purpose of the premises).

Subjective reasons for refusal:

household refusal to participate in the survey.

When processing cases of non-provision of data, non-responses for all reasons are compensated. For these processing purposes, the reweighting method is used, which consists of adjusting the sample weights.

- S.15.1 Overall accuracy

The standard sampling error and the standard relative sampling error are used as indicators of the accuracy of statistical estimation.

The standard error of a sample is the standard deviation of the value of a sample parameter from the sample mean of that parameter.

The relative standard error is the ratio of the estimated statistical value to its mean value.

The accuracy of the survey by districts is calculated once a year based on the indicators number of employed, number of unemployed, number of labor force, number not included in the labor force, share of the labor force, unemployment rate.

The standard error of the sample (μ) determines the possible discrepancies between the characteristics of the sample and the general population.

The value of the standard sampling error is determined by the formula:

$$\mu = \sqrt{\frac{\sigma^2}{n} \left(1 - \frac{n}{N}\right)}$$

Where,

 σ^2 – general dispersion;

n - the size of the sample population;

N – size of the general population.

According to the Methodology for constructing a sample of households for the employment survey, approved by the order of the Chairman of the Statistics Committee of the Ministry of National Economy of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated June 30, 2016 No. 132, when determining the size of the sample population for the current year for the employment survey, the calculation of the relative sampling error of the results of the employment survey for the previous year is used.

The relative sampling error is calculated annually and published in the bulletin "Main indicators in the labor market in the Republic of Kazakhstan".

Missing data occurs when a sample unit does not participate in the survey at all. A simple weight adjustment scheme is used to compensate for cases of total missing data.

In order to obtain data that are generalizable to the general population, statistical weighting of the survey results is performed.

The weighting of the results of a sample survey is carried out by assigning an appropriate weight to each individual unit of observation - a person.

Statistical tools, including indicators published in the spreadsheet "Main indicators of the labor market in the Republic of Kazakhstan" were developed taking into account the recommendations of international experts. In addition, the indicators were agreed with public/non-governmental organizations.

Data on the number of employed population by type of economic activity are provided to the Department of National Accounts for the calculation of the "Labour Productivity" indicators.

Data collection on the main indicators of the labor market is carried out on paper. Information processing processes are automated using local software packages, and input and output information controls are provided.

It has been established through time measurements that it takes approximately 10-15 minutes to conduct a questionnaire survey of one household member.

The average family size ratio according to the household living standards survey is 4 people.

Thus, the average amount of time spent on filling out one Questionnaire is 40-45 minutes.

S.21.3 Method (way) of collecting primary statistical data

The population survey on employment issues is carried out by interviewing specially trained interviewers through direct visits to households. The survey is conducted on a voluntary basis. All answers are recorded from the words of the respondents; no supporting documents are required. Answers to the questions posed can be obtained both from the respondents themselves and from adult family members living together, if the latter can give comprehensive answers to all questions.

The survey is conducted using statistical form T-001 "Questionnaire for a sample survey of employment of the population". The questionnaire is a specialized form that is used in each survey and contains a list of questions characterizing the labor participation of each member of the household. The questionnaire is filled out for each individual household (family) included in the sample.

Information is collected on a monthly basis.
